

Critical Industry Employee Authorization to Travel

To Whom it May Concern:

The individual in possession of this letter, who also has in their possession a Bloodworks identification badge, works in the healthcare industry and must travel to and from work and engage in their work activities regardless of the time of day as an employee in a sector that has been deemed by the US government as critical to the infrastructure of the United States.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) designates healthcare and Public Health Workers as "Critical Infrastructure Workers". This agency issued a Memorandum on <u>Identification of Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers During COVID-19 Response</u> on March 19, 2020 that specifically addressed this segment of the workforce.

Furthermore, in a March 16, 2020 guidance, the President of the United States instructed employees of Critical Infrastructure Industries, including the healthcare and public health sector, to continue to perform their normal job functions during the coronavirus pandemic.



Honolulu, HI

- Mar 23 Hawai'i Gov. Ige declared statewide "Stay-At-Home" order
